TechNet is the national network of technology companies that promotes the growth of the innovation economy through bipartisan advocacy at the federal and state level in all fifty states. TechNet's diverse membership includes dynamic American businesses ranging from small startups to the most prominent global companies and represents more than three million employees in the fields of information technology, e-commerce, clean energy, gig and sharing economy, venture capital, and finance.

We offer our testimony in support of the Attorney General's consensus driven process to deliver the bill, as amended, before you. TechNet has been involved in this discussion since the winter of 2020 and appreciates all of the stakeholders willingness and desire to get this legislation right. We are confident we are close to an amendment that reflects that consensus driven product.

As amended, the bill will provide Oregon with contact tracing legislation that regulates collection of personally identifiable data for COVID-19 response purposes. It will ensure that data that is collected solely for contact tracing is subject to strict secondary use prohibitions – used only for COVID-response purposes, and not for any additional purposes (e.g., tracking citizen movement across a state to inform economic indicators). We look forward to supporting the final amended product.
