Re: Proposed Air Quality Permit, NW Metals

The board of BRAVO Youth Orchestras is opposed to the issuing of the air quality permit requested by NW Metals to operate a diesel-powered shredder at 9537 N. Columbia Blvd.

The site is near Sitton Grade School and George Middle School where BRAVO operates daily after-school intensive music programs when school is in session. Many of our students and their families live in the immediate area. The disastrous fire in March, 2018, at their site in the Cully neighborhood resulted in the destruction of several homes and a partial evacuation of the neighborhood. Based on NW Metals' long history of environmental violations, failure to comply with court orders to correct the violations, and their failure to pay fines which were issued by the state for violations, we have no faith that they take the safety of the surrounding neighborhood seriously.

The majority of students who attend Sitton and George Middle School are low-income people of color, who already face the challenges of income and health disparities. Placing their health at further risk by exposure to toxic waste further increases the burden of these inequities.

Please do not add to the challenges of our students and their families by approving this permit.
