Rep. Helm, I particularly call on you to support HB 3265 because you know how vital immigrants are to the health and prosperity of our communities here in House District 34.

As a member of the Interfaith Movement for Immigrant Justice (IMIrJ), I am proud and humbled to be part of a network of people of faith and fierce love who have stood beside community members as they've navigated a broken immigration system that separates families and tears communities apart.
