My name is Travis Maloney, I am 21 years old, and I live in Carver, Oregon. I am writing you today because I oppose SB 844.

When I was a young boy, I was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes. It was very hard growing up always needing to check my insulin levels, and even as an adult, taking insulin is still a burden.

I am able to afford my insulin doses, but I know there are many diabetics out there that struggle with the costs. While I want to see insulin prices reduced, the implementation of a Prescription Drug Affordability Board will not fix this issue and actually create new access issues for many patients.
