Text HB 3368: (2) The department shall make the grant available to a religious or public-benefit nonprofit corporation to develop affordable housing for two pilot projects, one in an urban area and one in a rural area in an adjacent county. The grant may be used to purchase and develop land, purchase or develop housing or provide support services to residents of the housing.
