Sanctuary is a religious and spiritual term at heart. Can we afford to deny sanctuary at this critical juncture of our country's history? What kind of Oregon do you want to leave your children?

As a leader in the Interfaith Movement for Immigrant Justice (IMIrJ), I am part of a network of people of faith and fierce love who have accompanied community members as they've navigated an immigration system that separates families and tears communities apart. While it can often be hard to see as we navigate language in a bill, this law is really about people and communities together ensuring that all Oregonians feel safer. I urge you to pass HB 3265.
