

Background

The Charitable Checkoff Commission and the program were originally created by the Oregon Legislature more than three decades ago. Through the program, taxpayers can donate all or a portion of their personal income tax refund to any or all 29 charities approved by the Charitable Checkoff Commission. Taxpayers file Form OR-DONATE to designate the amount of their refund to donate to charity.

Problem

The program has evolved since its original inception in 1989. The original program contemplated a list of charities that would fit on the face of the personal income tax return form. Last year, Oregon taxpayers use a specific form (OR-DONATE) to donate almost \$2.7 million to 29 charities. The program has grown, and it would be helpful to update statute to continue to support this service for charities across the state.

Proposed Solution

House Bill 2129 makes the following changes to the program:

- Clarifies the role of the Charitable Checkoff Commission and its members.
- Updates the meeting frequency of the Charitable Checkoff Commission.
- Clarifies language around charities requalifying for inclusion on Form OR-DONATE.
- Removes the minimum requirement for donations a charity must receive to continue to qualify for the program.
- Clarifies governmental entities are not required to receive revenue from sources other than from charitable checkoff donations.
- Removes outdated statutory language references.
- Repeals outdated or unneeded statutes.
