## RE: SB 274: Protections for Sex Trafficked Minors

I extend my greatest appreciation as you review my testimony in support of SB 274: a bill that will **remove the criminalization of sexually exploited youth in Oregon.** 

- 1. Our laws as they stand today further traumatize and commodify sexually exploited youth in Oregon
- 2. Children/Youth who are sexually exploited should NOT have law enforcement or experience the youth carceral system as a result of their exploitation; as first responders or for lack of a trauma informed, survivor led, holistic placement
- Research shows that the use of sexually exploited children/youth for the purpose of prosecution does not result in higher conviction rates of the exploiter or the prevention of the child/youth's recidivism
- 4. Referencing sexually exploited children/youth as prostitutes further marginalizes this population who aren't legally responsible for their exploitation
- 5. Parents/Caregivers of sexually exploited children/youth should not be penalized as a result of the exploitation that is rooted in this countries exploitation of Indigenous and African peoples for capitalism.
- 6. The equitable method in creating change is through participatory research and accountability that is survivor led and reaches everyone who can/will come in contact with a sexually exploited child/youth
- SB 274 is the beginning of the development of a multi-disciplinary approach to a complex problem that disproportionately impacts child/youth of color (BIPOC) and those that identify as LGBTQ+
