Thank you, Co-Chair Gorsek and Co-Chair Sollman, members of the committee.

My name is Donna Bleiler and I represent 50 family members covering 10 industries in four counties. My testimony is in regard to HB 5014, the budget for the Department of Justice.

Oregon's Attorney General took an oath to defend the Oregon Constitution and that includes free speech. To date, we do not know the truth of residual effects of the covid-19 vaccines and evidence is mounting that doesn't look good. This is heading for major lawsuits if even a part of it turns out to be true. Government's job is to protect.

So when our Attorney General signed onto the letters to Jack Dorsey and Mark Zuckerberg, she wasn't protecting Oregonian's constitutional rights and put the state at risk for lawsuits.

We propose a Budget Note that formally directs the Attorney General to not use any resources or attach her name in behalf of Oregon citizens that goes against any constitutional rights of the people. We request that she withdraw her support and signature from the letter to Dorsey and Zackerberg as a violation of our constitutional rights nationally and under Oregon Constitution Article 1, Section 8.

Attorney General Rosenblum has a habit of promoting her personal agenda in her official role and not protecting our constitutional rights. Besides signing onto these letters to shut down free speech on vaccines, she has signed onto lawsuits challenging religious freedom executive orders rolling back contraceptive coverage mandate (State v. Trump), and she opposed a freedom of choice on union dues. She also

failed Oregonians when she opposed President Trump's Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017.

The Legislature creates measurable indicators for agency performance. To know that the Attorney General is truly representing Oregonians, a measurement of whether her action is determined to be constitutional should be measured for each action she takes on behalf of the state.
