In 2017, the Oregon Legislature unanimously passed HB 3149 which called for the completion of the Oregon Coast Trail. HB 3281 would be a significant boost to the work that has been progressing forward over the past four years by providing needed funding. Oregon is one of only three states that, by law, guarantees public access to our entire coast thanks to the Oregon Beach Bill.

The Oregon Coast Trail will attract avid hikers from not only Oregon and the Northwest, but also from around the world. Completion of the trail will boost the stature of the Oregon Coast Trail similar to world recognized trails in Europe, New Zealand, Australia, and Japan.
