

Patients are losing access to the primary care providers of their choice and Oregon small businesses are suffering.

Oregon has an ongoing shortage of primary care providers. The state and federal government spends nearly \$60 million every biennium to incentivize and retain PCPs in underserved areas of the state. This includes payments to Naturopathic Doctors (NDs), who are trained as primary care physicians and regulated in Oregon since 1927.

"Increase access to primary care provided by Naturopathic Physicians (NDs) by removing coverage and credentialing barriers. In some locations, NDs are an underutilized and immediately available primary care workforce"

— Recommendation from Oregon Health Policy Board's 5-year Strategic Plan

- There are over 1000 NDs licensed and practicing all across Oregon (ask us for your local ND!).
- Students of Naturopathic Medicine complete a 4year graduate medical program with the same science-based underpinnings as other providers.
- Average debt-load for a graduate is \$250,000; tuition averages \$35,000 annually.
- Residencies exist and are accredited, but must be paid for privately exac




