Dear Co-Chairs:

Community Action Program of East Central Oregon (CAPECO) Food Share is a regional food bank that serves Gilliam, Morrow, Umatilla, and Wheeler Counties. As a community organization on the front lines of fighting hunger in Oregon during the COVID-19 pandemic one of the reasons that we were able to respond so well was because of Oregon Hunger Response Funds and additional food purchasing provided by the Oregon Legislature. Hunger is an entrenched problem in Oregon and the pandemic is bringing this to light. To continue the ongoing fight against hunger the Oregon Food Bank Network is asking the Legislature to make \$4.56 million the new base budget for the Oregon Hunger Response Fund in the Oregon Department of Human Services budget for the 2021-2023 biennium by rolling up the 2019-2021 one-time funds. For the past several years the Oregon Food Bank Network has received \$4.56 million from the Oregon Hunger Response Fund. If we were to only receive the \$2.9 million allocated in the current base budget it would be detrimental to the agencies and programs that provide food to those in need.

CAPECO Food Share serves as one of 21 Regional Food Banks in the state-wide Oregon Food Bank Network. We partner with Oregon Food Bank, who delivers USDA commodities and donated food to our warehouse in Pendleton. CAPECO then distributes the product to local food pantries and individuals across our four-county region. Due to the pandemic, we have received an increased volume of food to respond to the growing need in the communities that we serve. The influx of food has put pressure on the food bank networks infrastructure, resulting in immediate investments in additional refrigeration, freezers and transportation capacity. To keep our staff and those accessing food assistance safe it was imperative that we alter our operations so an often venerable population could safely receive much needed food.

CAPECO, a non-profit, and our partners have always relied on volunteers to help provide the services that the community needs. Often these volunteers are older adults who generously donate their free time. However, fears related to COVID-19 and the potential vulnerability of volunteers has resulted in a decrease in donated time. This has meant we have had to reallocate staff to fill positions that were traditionally filled by volunteers. CAPECO has been fortunate enough to receive the Oregon Hunger Response Funds that have allowed us to increase our staff capacity to fill this void.
