Re: House Bill 3159 – Oregon Data Justice Act

Chair Prusak, Vice Chairs Hayden and Salinas, and members of the committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on the Data Justice Act- HB 3159. As the Executive Director for Consejo Hispano, a nonprofit organization working to create the equitable integration of the Latinx community into Oregon's broader social and economic fabric and covering Columbia, Clatsop and Tillamook Counties, as well as a member of the Racial Justice Council, I share my support for the Data Justice Act.
