Dear Senators.

I strongly encourage you to oppose SB832 in its current form. While I can appreciate your efforts to protect agricultural workers in your state from the effects of COVID-19, this bill is a misguided attempt to use a crisis to eradicate an entire legitimate industry. As you may be aware, there has only been one documented case of the virus that causes COVID-19 being found among mink in our state. Fortunately, due to the conscientious efforts of the farm involved, our State Department of Agriculture and Food was able to respond based on science and data in a way that protected agricultural workers without eliminating an industry.

There is no scientific justification based on the COVID-19 pandemic to eliminate an entire industry. Given that, I must conclude that this bill has nothing to do with protecting public health and is just another attempt by animal rights groups to eliminate animal husbandry in your state. Section 6 contains a list of other types of farms that could be targeted next, namely, foxes, chinchilla, rabbits, caracul, and ratites. Based on my interactions with those who have supported the bill, banning these farms would only be the beginning. There will be an energized push to get rid of all farm-raised animals, including chickens, turkeys, pigs, and cattle, among many others.
