I support a phase-out of these facilities because: Mink farming forces animals that are genetically suited to live a free-roaming life in the wild to live instead in small metal cages and be slaughtered after living only a fraction of their normal lives.2•Large populations of highly confined mink have been found particularly susceptible to zoonotic diseases such as Covid-19, which they may then spread to people and other animals.3•Confined animal feeding operations for mink are resource intensive and have other detrimental environmental impacts –more so than textiles made to serve the same function.4•Fur from the mink on Oregon fur farms goes into unnecessary, luxury goods. Simply put, the ends do not justify the means.
