Chair Marsh, Vice-Chair Helm, Vice-Chair Brock Smith, and Members of the House Committee on Energy and Environment,

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of House Bill 2021 with the -5 and-9 amendments, the 100% Clean Energy for All bill. I have lived in Eugene for over forty years and am a retired teacher. I am an avid walker, hiker, organic gardener, and grandmother! I have always cared deeply about our environment, renewable energy, clean water, our native people and equity. When we added on to our home many years ago we included design for a passive solar sun room and preheat our water with a passive solar system.
