I'm writing in support of Governor Brown's budget especially in regard to increased funding for early learning and Oregon prekindergarten. My family has benefited greatly from our involvement with Early Head Start in Multnomah County and Head Start in Clackamas County. I had never heard of these programs nor what they had to offer until an advocate reached out to us after my son was born. We were assigned a home visitor who had a diaper allocation. Has anyone bought diapers lately? They're pricey. She was able to provide us a monthly allotment that helped us save a bit every month on our grocery bill.

Even more impactful was when my son was diagnosed with a low level bi-lateral hearing impairment through a nurse-run health screening sponsored by Head Start. Not even his pediatrician was aware he had a problem. Due to early detection, we were able to find a specialist for further evaluation and formulate a plan with our pediatrician to monitor his hearing.

Through Early Head Start and Head Start I also learned various tools and techniques to work on his motor skills, his cognitive abilities, and how to better deal with the frustration that comes with raising a little human. The socialization with other kids his age, pre-covid, was also a huge benefit in attending center-based Head Start.

Affiliation with these organizations has made me a better parent. I've participated in parenting classes made available through the program which have helped me reduce my stress, approach problems with more love and understanding, and forge a better bond with my kids. I believe an increased budget for early learning and pre-k would make these programs available to more families which would benefit more big and little Oregonians.
