Co-Chairs Johnson, Steiner Hayward and Rayfield, and members of the committee:

My name is Jacob Reece and I live in Bend and work in Prineville.

As a project engineer in construction with an accounting background, who is taking the opportunity to gain the valuable LEED (Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design) Certification, I see the value in transitioning to a clean energy economy as soon as possible. I ask that as you consider how to use federal funding from the American Rescue Plan Act and balance the state budget, you fully fund our transition to a clean energy economy through funding existing climate programs and future additions.
