Thank you for the opportunity for the Tillamook County Creamery Association to share our support for the proposed \$1 million in funding to address food insecurity, food access and support for BIPOC farmers in Oregon.

Tillamook Creamery is a 112-year-old farmer-owned, farmer-led cooperative, which is known for the quality of the products we produce and for our commitment to working collaboratively with a diverse set of stakeholders to solve complex problems.
