My name is Alex Dassise and I am a recent graduate from Portland State University. Today I am asking for you to invest \$290 M in the Oregon Opportunity Grant and \$900 M in the Public University Support Fund.

Right now, over ¾ of Oregon students who qualify for and need the Oregon Opportunity Grant do not receive it, purely due to severe underfunding. If Oregon is going to recover from COVID-19, it is vital that we invest in student aid so that students can afford to finish degrees and find good paying jobs after school. Now is a critical time to get the state where it needs to be regarding financial aid access.
