Movie theaters were not included in the \$25 million that went to live performance venues, last year. They have been largely overlooked in the relief aid programs.

Due to COVID 19, independent movie theaters and their owners/operators, such as Salem Cinema and owner Loretta Miles, are in serious jeopardy without your help. Funding is desperately needed to help address fixed costs incurred while movie theaters were required to close their doors for the past year. In addition, movie theaters will incur heavy capital expenses to reopen safely in a post -COVID environment.
