My name is Jennifer Cuthers and I am a student at Lane Community College working towards a degree in Business. Today I am asking for you to invest \$290 M in the Oregon Opportunity Grant, the state's largest need based financial aid program.

I receive the Oregon Opportunity Grant. The strain on myself and my family of paying for school during this pandemic is immense. In order to afford tuition and fees, textbooks, rent, and food I am forced to make sacrifices in order to repay my loans when I get out of school, such as cutting down my food budget and general living expenses in order to save and get by.
