These bills are particularly important pieces of legislation for the classified staff at the Hillsboro, Scappoose, and Grant School Districts, which AFT-Oregon has the honor of representing.

As this committee is well aware, the global COVID-19 pandemic has exposed many of the challenges and inequities faced by Oregonians. SB 496A and SB 495 are both necessary public policy solutions that will go a long way in helping to remove yet another barrier that food service and other workers in our schools face when trying to access unemployment benefits.
