- 1. May E Board meeting: \$8.5 million General Fund (distributed)
- **2.** August Special Session: \$6 million General Fund (distributed; for providers of affordable housing)
- **3.** Fall 2020: \$55 million First federal stimulus package (Corona Virus Relief Fund, distributed):
 - Note: Oregon, unlike many other states, did not have to return these dollars to the federal government. There were some hurdles, but OHCS and local organizations successfully retained these dollars for landlords in Oregon.
- **4.** December 21, 2020: Third special session, using state General Funds: \$200 million (with \$150M in the Landlord Compensation Fund) (currently being distributed)
 - Note: The first \$50 million round of LCF funding has closed, and award announcements have been made. Everyone who was eligible will receive funding. Round 2 of funding will open April 29th.
 - \$40 million for assistance thru tenant applications has been fully distributed to local organizations, where payment to landlords is happening now via tenant applications, and approximately 50% has been committed or spent. \$10 million to be distributed shortly.
- **5.** Late December, 2020: Trump Administration stimulus <u>package</u>: \$282 million in rent assistance payments to landlords, based on tenant applications. (Expected to begin distribution in early-mid May)
- **6.** Anticipated Biden Administration stimulus package: Approximately \$250 million (anticipated to be made available sometime this summer)

Grand total: Approximately \$801 million.

Note: There may have been other funds, from other federal programs such as CDBG and from local governments.
