Our board believes that those persons impacted by the fires should be able to rebuild in an efficient and timely manner and that we reduce burdens so our citizens can get back to where they were before the fires.

HB2341 is just one of many citizen-focused efforts to make sure now more than ever our government services are flexible and responsive to the individual needs of those impacted. We appreciate the efforts of Representative Marsh, Representative Gomberg and Senator Findley (and many others too numerous to list) working with state and local groups to identify those areas where an extra set of "tools" in the toolbelt can help state and local officials meet those individual needs. As stated in the staff measure summary below, this bill authorizes the proration of property taxes which can go a long way to help consumers that must wrestle with insurance and cash flow as they try to rebuild from the fire:

"House Bill 2341 would authorize a tax collector in a county covered by a state of emergency declared by Governor due to fire or act of God, or authority of Governor under Emergency Conflagration Act, who knows or has reason to believe a property has been destroyed or damaged by fire or act of God to prorate taxes imposed on that property, and provides a new proration computation for property types other than specially assessed property."
