We envision a society in which persons with disabilities have equality of opportunity, full participation, and the ability to exercise meaningful choice.

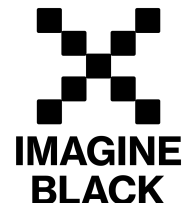

I've lived an unconventional life. My prison sentence ended January 4th, 2019. Today I study public health at the OHSU-PSU School of Public Health. I'm a decarceration and drug policy reform advocate with an emphasis on improving jail and prison conditions and re-entry pathways. I will go to law school in 2022.

I spent 5 years addicted to heroin and 4 years incarcerated as a direct result of my addiction. Now I advocate, write, and speak.
