Title: SB 88, ODDS: Housekeeping

Summary:

- Senate Bill 20 was passed during the 2019 legislative session. The purpose of this legislation was to provide the Office of Developmental Disabilities Services (ODDS) with needed flexibility to work with people served, partners and stakeholders to reflect improvements and a vision for the case management system defined by OARs.
- The legislation moved certain Community Developmental Disabilities Programs (CDDP) functions from ORS 430.664 to ORS 430.662. This move made references to 430.664 elsewhere in statute inaccurate.
- This bill corrects these references. Inaccurate references are in 427.005, 430.695, 417.349, 179.505, 497.162 and 417.349.

Impact if not passed:

- Without a change to ORS 427.005, relating to the definition of a director of a community developmental disabilities program, there is the possibility of complicating, and perhaps opening challenges to, involuntary commitment procedures. The CDDP director is given specific authorities and responsibilities in ORS 427.215 through 427.306.
- Without a change to ORS 430.695, funds intended for developmental disabilities services could be able to be directed elsewhere.
- Without a change to ORS 497.162, ODFW would no longer be obligated to provide free fishing licenses to individuals receiving case management from a CDDP.

Fiscal impact:

- The proposed legislation will have no fiscal impact.
