- It wasn't too long ago that my sister and I were in elementary school. Being the son of hard working agricultural workers, my parents would work sun-up to sun-down.
  - This meant that as the eldest sibling, assumed the role of caretaker, cook and even tutor for my sister.
- While my family qualified for free & reduced lunch, the application process was tedious and confusing... I remember that during the weeks between submitting and getting our application approved, facing suspension for being caught stealing food from the school cafeteria.
  - My sister and I joined thousands of students who have their learning interrupted by avoidable issues such as food insecurity.
- Our schools must be safe havens, and actively work to provide comfortable learning
  environments for our students. HB 2536 is a logical next step in eliminating food insecurity from
  our schools, and I am looking forward to a broader conversation on how we can expand free and
  reduced lunch programs in schools, and rise to the needs of our students.
