Capital Investment **Priority**

Demonstration site for high-quality, culturally-specific Latino/x preschool.

The proposed investment supports Latino Network's planned La Plaza Esperanza in East Multnomah County, where more than 50,000 Latino/x residents live in an underserved area. Approximately 30% of the facility's services will be dedicated to meeting needs of families with preschool children.

La Plaza Esperanza advances Latino Network's mission: to positively transform the lives of Latino youth, families, and communities.

A \$4 million state investment can achieve a transformational impact for children from Latino/x families. There are currently few options for culturally-specific, high-quality early learning programs for Latino/x children. Addressing this gap is essential to achieving systemic equity goals for Oregon's children. The requested investment is part of a public/private partnership in a \$12 million facility.

Impact of Investment

- Responds to Oregon's facility shortage with 4,300 sf preschool designed to best practice standards.
- Addresses preschool workforce shortage in Oregon by serving as a training site for Latino/x parents to convert lived experience into professional skills.
- Low-income Latino/x families will have access to full-time, high-quality preschool; the demonstration site will provide a replicable model that can be used to serve Latino/x children across the state.
- All Latino/x preschool children will have access to culturally-specific children's programming at La Plaza Esperanza, home of the demonstration preschool. Approximately 4,500 Latino/x children under age 6 live within five miles of the site.
