Healing Touch Practitioners should not be included in Bill HB 2493. Since 1990, the Healing Touch Program (HTP) has proudly granted practitioner certification to individuals who exhibit the professionalism, discipline and dedication required to meet the established criteria to be a Healing Touch Certified Practitioner. The requirements are rigorous and are designed to instill knowledge, skill and confidence in the practitioner. The Healing Touch Certified Practitioner (HTCP) credential is recognized in Energy Medicine and allopathic medicine as a significant professional accomplishment. The following are required to apply for practitioner certification:

Completion of Healing Touch Program Levels 1 – 5

One year of formal mentorship with an approved mentor

Evidence of a Healing Touch Practice and preparing a case study addressing four to five sessions with a client

Completion of additional reading and reflection reports on educational resources, ethics, professionalism and growth as a healer
