I oppose this bill because it has the potential of placing an unneeded burden on alternative therapy practioners across the state. Dur to the langauge of the bill, many of these practicioners will have to close down their business and be out of work. Additionally, this will therefore increase the already high poverty rate in Oregon, add thousands of more people that need to be regulated by the State. This also interferes with many religious and spiritiual counselors in Oregon where they will not be able to full practice due to this extraneous law, infringing upon their right to practice their chosen spiritual expression.
