COHC has shown itself to be more than a "one off" or a "unique experiment" in how communities can govern their CCO. I believe the Central Oregon Health Council has shown how central Oregon has truly created the cost-saving, community-focused, creative health care provision that was envisioned with CCOs came into existence. Not only should the sunset for the COHC be repealed, but I believe that COHC should be studied and replicated around the state.
