Dear Co-chairs Frederick and McLain and committee members,

I write to request that you please fund Dispute Resolution which provides for reduced-to-no cost community dispute resolution services across the state through the Oregon Office for Community Dispute Resolution (OOCDR). As a private practitioner of landlord-tenant law in Wasco, Hood River, Sherman, Gilliam and Umatilla Counties, Overland Law, LLC, wholeheartedly supports Six Rivers Dispute Resolution Center's services.

I took a leap of faith and founded my solo law practice in the fall of 2019 as a different kind of law firm. I focus on access to justice issues around landlord-tenant law by providing significant pro bono consultations and representation for tenants. I also represent smaller "mom-and-pop" landlords in the area. Oftentimes I receive a phone call for a situation where it is obvious that more lawyers and further escalation is not in the best interest of any of the parties – or the community.

I frequently refer community members to Six Rivers and I look forward to continuing to do so in the future. As landlords and tenants both struggle to pay their expenses, Six Rivers DRC provides a forum for them to discuss realistic and necessary solutions to their shared dilemmas. Six Rivers DRC emphasizes workable solutions so that community members can build towards stable living situations.

I am a vocal advocate for Six Rivers in our community and on social media. I have been honored to work with their volunteer mediators regarding recent updates to Oregon landlord-tenant law and I'm exciting to continue working with them in the future.
