Co-Chairs Frederick, McLain, and members of the Joint Ways and Means, Subcommittee on Education:

My name is DeAujZhane Coley and I am a recent graduate of Howard University where I majored in Human Performance, Human Health and Leisure studies. I am submitting this testimony in support of OHSU's budget, and in particular OHSU's policy option package request to expand access to *OnTrack OHSU!*, which works to provide exploratory and impactful health science learning experiences to Oregon students and increases science interest and identity.

My connection with OHSU and the *OnTrack OHSU!* program began when I was a freshman at Jefferson High School located in North Portland. At 15 years old, I was eager to get more involved in the sciences and a teacher encouraged me to apply for a competitive program to be summer intern at OHSU. It was completion of that first internship at OHSU that set the tone for my career goals and formed my outlook on my possibilities of pursuing a career in medicine.
