Free Meal by Direct Certification \% is the percent of total students who receive free meals through Direct Certification.
Direct Certification status is determined by state agencies and shared electronically with school districts. Students or families qualify for Direct Certification through a number of avenues such as eligibility for SNAP or TANF, Migrant Ed, or foster care.
Direct Certification excludes students eligible for free or reduced price meals by paper application or students eligible for free meals because they are enrolled in a CEP school but who would not meet income guidelines if they were not at a CEP school.
Free Meal by Direct Certification \% is the only comparable measure of economic hardship across all schools.

Overage stipends only reflect those of General Education K-12 teachers and K-5 Educational Specialists, who received a payment for being over the student load threshold listed in the Contract with the Teacher's Union (related to overall class size).
