Senators Riley, Wagner and Burdick,

I am writing you today to express the Tigard Chambers' opposition to SB 137-2 in terms of taxing forgiven PPP loans in excess of \$100,000.00

The Tigard Chamber of Commerce and its' members businesses account for over 16,000 jobs. These businesses provide living-wage jobs for families in our community. We support entrepreneurs and the jobs they create. By accessing PPP loans during the pandemic, businesses were able to manage their way through the uncertain economic impacts of the pandemic, keep employees working and help stimulate our economy versus adding further to our unemployment percentages.

Much of our small business community has been dealt a huge economic blow due to the pandemic. You can see that in our trends with unemployment numbers and the slow recovery of employment.
