I am submitting testimony to oppose SB 857. This legislation is born out of special interest agendas and is not representative of the community at large.

I use my tow boat out on the river to enjoy time with my family. This is where we spend most of our time during summer months and have enjoyed our time together for many years, this restriction will limit what boaters can do and possibly lose revenue from the boaters registration fees we pay annually.

Our waterway policies should be grounded in solid research and favor the general public, not select waterfront homeowners and paddlers looking to eliminate motorized boating for their own personal gain. Real studies should be conducted to determine the best ways to keep the river safe and healthy. Furthermore, the Newberg Pool is already one of the most regulated bodies of water in Oregon, and wake surfing is only allowed in two small zones with no adjacent homes.

This bill will make our waterways less safe and negatively impact Oregon families and small businesses. The House already extensively debated this bill and did not move forward. I respectfully urge you to do the same. Oregon needs our senators focused on COVID, economic recovery and getting our kids back in school. Please do not waste time on this unnecessary legislation.
