Testimony in favor of SB 319

The Oregon State Council of the Vietnam Veterans of America strongly endorses SB 319 currently under consideration in the Oregon legislature. We have been supporters of this project since it was first conceived.

This project will build a statewide memorial to the sacrifices made by Oregonians in the Vietnam war. It will recognize those who paid the ultimate sacrifice as well as those who continue to suffer some fifty years after returning home.
