I'd like to introduce myself. My name is Bruce Lawson and I'm a native Oregonian with 37yrs experience in filmmaking. I grew up in Portland, Graduated from University of Oregon and I chose to raise my family and make my living here in my home state rather than migrate to another state.

I am writing to urge the passing of Bill SB43 - which is the +6 year extension bill for both the OPIF and GOLR programs.

I have been fortunate enough to work on both TV Series' and Features due to the success of these program(s). Without these program(s), I would not have been able to support myself or my family.

Especially with the recent shutdown due to Covid-19, the need for a multi- year program to help future projects coming from within Oregon and being recruited from elsewhere is essential.

In 1996 I started a partnership with my brother Brent and we formed BLT Productions, L.L.C.. We invested in a full Feature Grip package which continued to grow. Then in 2006, due to increased growth and business we were able to purchase both a 48' and 35' trailer to provide grip support for any project ranging from commercials to major motion pictures.

We have traveled and worked our gear throughout not only the state of Oregon but across the country when a state with more <u>aggressive incentives</u> would lure a production away from Oregon.

Our Investments and commitment to growth are made possible due to the increased projects locally filmed in Oregon. These projects came here due to the quality crew, abundant locations and the incentive which the state provides. We must not only continue to offer an incentive to film here in Oregon but we must try to be even more competitive with states like Georgia, Massachusetts, Louisiana and New Mexico.

I encourage you to do all you can to insure the continued success of our great film industry here in Oregon. I feel that together, we can pass this extension as well as get an increase in our incentive and promote diversity, equity and inclusion in our industry.
