Re: Testimony re: HB 2109

Dear Chair Marsh, Vice-Chair Helm, Vice-Chair Brock Smith, and Members of the Committee,

Renewable Northwest is a regional, non-profit renewable energy advocacy organization based in Oregon, dedicated to decarbonizing the region by accelerating the transition to renewable electricity. Our members are a combination of renewable energy businesses and environmental and consumer groups. Oregon Solar Energy Industries Association (OSEIA) is a trade association founded in 1981 to promote clean, renewable, solar technologies. OSEIA members include businesses, non-profit groups, and other solar industry stakeholders. We provide a unified voice of the solar industry and focus exclusively on the solar value chain; from workforce development to permitting, advocacy, policy, and regulation for manufacturing, residential, commercial, community, and utility scale solar projects on the local, state and regional level.

Renewable Northwest and OSEIA encourage the Committee to support passage of HB 2109, to clarify procedural requirements for the Energy Facility Siting Council and the Department of Land Development and Conservation (DLCD).

When HB 2329 was passed in 2019, it inadvertently triggered a requirement that, if enacted, would cost DLCD a considerable amount of funding. The intention was not to create a new unfunded mandate for DLCD and so OSEIA and RNW support this technical fix.
