Dear Chair Marsh, Vice Chair Brock Smith, Vice Chair Helm and members of the Committee,

My name is Cameron Langley, I live in Coos Bay, and I am unemployed but I take care of my family while my mother works at Bay Area Hospital and my stepfather works at 7 Devils. I'm not necessarily affiliated with any organization that would matter to my writing of this, but I am passionate about my environment and community, especially those in my community with lower income. We are in an age where technology, and with it, electricity, are required to live decently in society. Everything from school to jobs to entertainment to basic things like the ability to cook, clean, or regulate temperatures requires power, and thus means power should be as accessible to people as possible.
