I have been one of the only women on the production crew in a majority of the jobs that I have been a part of. This has also meant that I have had to fight to be heard, to have my role on the crew respected, and have even had to step in to voice concerns over the way that female roles were written. I even considered leaving the industry altogether because I did not see a future for myself in it and I definitely didn't see myself in the stories being told. I am also a white woman, and have been very aware of an almost complete lack of people of color on a majority of film crews, especially women of color.

Diversity and equity aren't just buzz words, they will positively affect the careers and lives of so many creative and dedicated film makers who are already out there struggling to work! And they will greatly improve the storytelling of Oregon-made films!

Please **vote YES on HB 3010** to encourage diversity, equity, and inclusion in our local production industry. I look forward to witnessing the change that comes about when this bill passes!
