I am writing you today in opposition of HB 2930

As a lifelong Oregonian and a registered Democrat, I have always been and always will be a champion of unions and workers rights. But today I am torn, I understand the intent of this bill, especially during todays political climate but I find myself at odds with what this will create.

As a strong supporter of unions and workers rights, I do not support this bill. Police Officer's rights are workers rights. Public employees don't lose protections or representation simply for becoming Police Officers. Once again, I cannot stand here and say I am pro-union and pro-workers rights while simultaneously attempting to remove protections from public employees.
