

Survivor Investment Partnership (SIP) Policy Option Package (POP) #130



The SIP POP was put forward by the Oregon Department of Human Services' (ODHS) Self-Sufficiency Program (SSP) and is included as a \$10M investment in the Governor's Recommended Budget. SIP was developed in partnership with the Governor's Office, the Oregon Tribes, culturally specific Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault (DVSA) providers and our partner DVSA providers statewide.

SIP recognizes that tribes and culturally specific organizations know their communities best and survivors know their circumstances best.

Increase accessibility and meaningful financial support for survivors

The intent of the SIP POP is to increase the accessibility of advocacy services and meaningful financial support to survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault including Tribal communities, individuals without children, and vulnerable populations.

Increase autonomy and resources for providers

The funding gives tribes and organizations autonomy on how to administer their programs and provides survivors the ability to decide which supports they need to stay safe and maintain stability. In addition to serving survivors in a more culturally holistic way and providing resources for those who may be ineligible for the Temporary Assistance for Domestic Violence Survivors (TA-DVS) Program, a portion of the funds will support the administrative costs of overseeing the program.

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
