During this time I have witnessed elected officials stop enforcing current laws and instead enact new laws that do nothing to address the issues our society is dealing with. I find it very interesting that the idea of restricting my Constitutional Rights will create less crime and violence. All it creates is law abiding citizens to have to decide either have the tools to protect themselves and become criminals or don't follow the law and become a criminal. The active shooter incident at Clackamas Mall was interrupted by someone who had a CCL.

I know this should be common knowledge but criminals DO NOT follow the law. Criminals are now carrying more drugs and firearms on their person than ever before. Violence is up. Oregon ranks as one of the lowest states for access to mental health care and we have unfunded beds at the state hospitals. Homeless and drug use is out of control. Energy should be put forward to finding long lasting solutions to these problems witch help fuel crime and violence in our communities first.
