I write in support of this bill to allow for more housing around our transit stations. This bill will help our state accommodate our growing population without the need to further sprawl out onto our farm and forest land. This will mean less congestion on our roads, and lower carbon emmisions than if those homes are instead built as sprawl on the periphery of their region.

I also greatly apreciate the inclusion of a bonus to bulding size and unit quantity when affordable housing is included. We have a tremendous shortage of homes at every income level, but it's by far the the most dire for our low income neighbors. This carrot aproach is used in Portland and has started to show success there, and it can also be successful in the rest of the Portland region and state as well.

With all that said. I ask that this bill be ammended to expand the area around stations that is subject to it. As writen, only 1/8 of a mile around stations would be subject to the bill. I urge you to expand that to  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a mile, which is about a 10 minute walk. This change will ensure that we maximize the massive capital investment that we've put into our light rail system by allowing for more housing to be built in the entire station walkshed, and not just the lots immediately adjacent.
