Dear Senate and Health Care Committees,

My name is Jeanne Pace and I am a patient of Dr Edie Vickers, ND. I would like to share my experience working with an ND to show the importance of this profession in the delivery of quality healthcare in the state of Oregon.

I have worked with Dr Vickers since 1998. My husband and I were referred to her by a nurse with the American Cancer Society when my husband was diagnosed with prostate cancer and facing a radical prostatectomy.
