Dear Chair Prusak and Members of the House Health Committee,

I am a mother from Portland and a licensed healthcare provider who has chosen a home birth for my second child after learning about the many benefits of home birth and the exceptional, personalized, evidence-based care that midwives provide. My experiences so far have supported this.

Though midwifery care provides large cost savings to insurers and health systems, I was disappointed and disheartened to learn that my insurance company does not cover home birth. The out-of-pocket expense for our family is significant; many families still can't access midwifery care because about half of Oregon insurers (both private and OHP) provide limited or no coverage for birth center or home birth midwifery care.
