



RE: Tobacco Retail Licensing in Oregon SB 587

Our names are Io (13), Mari (14) and Ana (13) and we are residents of Portland and Happy Valley. We are writing in support of SB 587, which is for tobacco retail licensing in the state of Oregon. Here are the main reasons we support this bill:

- Tobacco can drive families apart because the chemicals in tobacco are toxic and addictive.
- Tobacco retail licensing would make it harder for youth to get tobacco as it is too easy for them to obtain it right now. Tobacco has a negative impact on teens because second hand smoke can cause health problems such as asthma and lung cancer. Teens can be influenced by community members who are smoking.
