I am writing in support of SB574 and I am asking for your yes vote.

I am a retired Coast Guard Chief and spent my last four years stationed in San Francisco California. While I was there I Commuted everyday across the Bay Bridge to Treasure Island. It was a daily occurrence for motorcycle riders to lane split. In four years I never saw an accident caused by this safe and convenient traffic scheme.

Since moving back to Portland I have chosen to commute via motorcycle. Primarily this decision was based on fuel savings and environmental concern. I quickly began to appreciate the convenience of being allowed to use the carpool lane between where I work at OHSU and live on Hayden Island. Unfortunately I have noticed recently that the carpool lane is increasingly used by single occupant vehicles (carpool cheaters).
